#### 15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

During the last 5 years important changes have been introduced by the University. In 2015 CBCS was introduced by Vinoba Bhave University, Hazaribag with detailed regulations.

The Institution has all the three core faculties Arts, Science and Commerce with the senior teachers heading the departments. Apart from the core subjects students also opt for two generic subjects and AECC. Our college has PG departments in Commerce, English, Hindi, Psychology and History.

The college encourages its teachers towards research and enhancement of teaching process. Together with regular classroom activities various tools and techniques are also employed to impart teaching & learning to students. Activities like (a) presenting paper in seminar, (b) participating in debate (c) participating in workshop and (d) group discussion are encourage.

Sports activities and Yoga classes are emphasized by the teachers. This helps in the overall growth of the students.
