The use of technology has assumed the proportion of being a significant tool in the teaching-learning processes in our college and the use of technology has become quite common among the teachers of the college. The college has BCA computer Lab. which offers teaching and training to a number of students. The teachers having knowledge of computers sometimes use power point presentations for the students. Infact the new contractual teachers are very well versed in the use of technology. During the pandemic of COVID 19, since March 2020, the college has adopted the method of online teaching on a regular basis in an organized manner. A time-table is in place, and about seventy percent of the students are connected through their WhatsApp. These students also have started enjoying and responding to this online teaching method, which is delivered through Google Meet. During the last five and a half months curriculum has been delivered online, and very effectively. Internal test for the sixth, second and fourth semester students has been successfully conducted online.

The duration of exam is 1½ hours and it is scheduled by the institute. The examination department maintains attendance of students who appear for the internal Examination. Answer books are maintained for record. All HOD's maintain record of the marks allotted in the internal exams. Several meetings of the Staff-Council were held by the principal with all the teachers where the curriculum designed for the CBCS semester system and the regulations incorporated therein were discussed at length. The process of internal assessment is continued for all 6 semesters. So far two batches of students have graduated from the college since the CBCS semester system was introduced by the university, and the college has tried its level best to maintain the standards.
